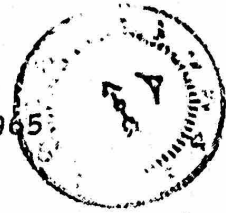

Subject: Disposition of Glenn Michaels Map at Ford Pavilion

A number of sources have indicated an interest in receiving the Glenn Michaels map at the close of the Fair. W. J. Mitchel has suggested that Ed Hillen discuss with Sluiter and Millar its possible use in the future reception center in the new FMCC building. R. Ruddell indicates strong interest on the part of the architects for the new Dearborn library.

If for any reason the map should be unsuitable for use in the reception center, it would be desirable to determine this at an early date so that consideration may be given to donating it to the library while the architectural details are still fluid.

The purpose of this memorandum is (a) to inform Jack Mullaly of this interest in the map and (b) to request Ed Hillen to explore the situation and determine whether there is now any reason to assume that the map might not be suitable for the reception center. This should be done by mid-April. If plans are not far enough advanced to determine this, I will ask R. Ruddell to discourage any further interest by the Dearborn library.

Memo to: W. J. Mitchel, Jr.

R. Millar and E. J. Hillen agree that there would be no suitable location for the Glenn Michaels map in the proposed reception area in the FMCC building. The only possible location for the map would be a temporary wall which would be structurally inadequate and esthetically inappropriate.

It was suggested that the map could be offered to plant engineering for use in another Company location, but Millar and I feel the Dearborn library would be a more appropriate setting than most Company locations. The tax rebate would also reflect favorably on the wisdom of those who urged the acquisition of this, rather than the more commercial alternatives.
