Gentlemen:

At your request and in accordance with Paragraph 2(d) of the letter agreement between WED Enterprises, Inc. and Ford Motor Company dated April 23, 1961, you are hereby authorized to incur additional costs in connection with the research and development phases of your suggested attraction for the 1964 New York World's Fair and to charge us for such costs in an amount up to, but not exceeding, Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00).

The sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) is to be expended by you in accordance with the terms of our letter agreement for the following purposes:

(a) A sum of money up to, but not exceeding, Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) shall be used to pay Walton Becket & Associates for tentative and preliminary schematic outlines of the building concept. It is understood that Walton Becket & Associates shall be paid by you on the basis two times payroll cost (which is defined as the hourly rate paid employees devoting time to this matter multiplied by the number of hours devoted.) You shall rebill us in the same amount as you are billed.

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(b) A sum of money up to, but not exceeding, Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) shall be used to reimburse you for costs, incurred and to be incurred by you in connection with the obligations undertaken by you in said letter agreement, over and above the amount provided for such reimbursement in said letter agreement.

(c) A sum of money up to, but not exceeding, Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) to be used to reimburse you in the development of additional story line concepts, to be presented to us prior to June 15, 1961.
