Jim Cummings just called and told me of your inquiry concerning the status of our New York World's Fair project. Since I talked with you last we have retained Welton Becket and Associates as architects to work with the Walt Disney organization in developing our show.

The supervision of the architect's work on this project is being handled, like other company projects, by our Plant Engineering Staff. Mr. D. Carlton Bell is the man on that Staff who has been assigned to the World's Fair project. I have discussed with him my conversations with you regarding the importance of a landscape architect. As a matter of fact, I have forwarded to him your earlier recommendations.

While I have not been directly involved, I do know that the matter of a landscape architect has been discussed on several occasions but I don't believe any commitments have as yet been made. If you would care to pursue the matter further I would suggest that you get in touch either with Mr. Bell here or directly with the Becket people.

In any event, this brings you up to date with developments at this end. Thank you very much for your continuing interest.
