Dear Senator:

This is an enthusiasm which you share not only with Carl Sandburg, but with many others. There is something specific you can do to promote and satisfy interest in Lincoln, and at the same time to aid the World's Fair and the State of Illinois. Let me explain briefly.

Circarama called "One Nation Under God" or the "Hall of Presidents".

It features Lincoln, life-size, rising from a chair and speaking, with a background of dramatic action pictures and music. It is one of the most moving things I have ever seen. I don't know whether the entire "Hall of Presidents" is needed. Lincoln is the main feature or cynosure. We would like to have this Circarama presented as part of the exhibit of the State of Illinois at the Fair. Illinois has signed up, but has done nothing further. Preparations are lagging and the time is short. I believe you could be most influential in persuading the authorities of the State to make this Lincoln exhibit the main feature of the Illinois Pavilion. I am persuaded that this would be one of the most popular exhibits in the entire Fair.

I have asked our Executive Vice-President, General William Potter, to see you about this at your convenience. I am sure that he will be glad to come to Washington at almost any time.
