Dear Mike:

Your confidential memo reached this office just two days after my visitations in Springfield which determined the financial limitations of the Commission for 1965. The Governor's office, the Department of Finance, and the leaders of the Legislature have all agreed to a final appropriation total.

Let me assure you that we have a lean budget that could not be stretched out for the additional four weeks of operating costs. Furthermore, it would be impossible to go through the necessary channels for a second time to adjust the total upwards.

I have consulted with Commission Chairman Newman and Secretary Craves representing our Executive Committee, and I have been directed to inform you that Illinois could not extend the operation of its Pavilion. We also want to register a protest if we incur additional housekeeping, security, and administrative costs because the Fair is kept open in spite of our closing on the original date of Cotober 17.

Since our decision is based solely on finances, we did not even consider the theoretical advantages of more exposure. It seems debatable whether attendance would hold up into the fall to justify a longer period. We would appreciate further background on the proposal and the results of your survey memo.
